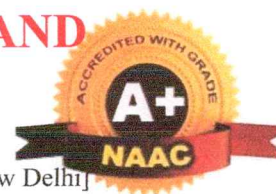

3. Proceedings of the Day

3.1 Inaugural Session — Welcome and Introduction

The programme commenced with a warm welcome extended to the esteemed students, parents, and faculty members, setting a positive and encouraging tone for the day ahead.

3.3 Address by the Chairman

Addressing the gathering, the Chairman warmly welcomed the students to a new academic journey at VMTW. He remarked that it was with great pleasure and a deep sense of responsibility that he welcomed them, noting that the day marked the beginning of an exciting adventure filled with opportunities, challenges, and growth.

He emphasised that as the students step into the world of engineering, their experience would be shaped not only by their academic pursuits but also by their lifestyle and habits. Success in this field, he observed, requires more than technical knowledge alone; it demands discipline, resilience, and a balanced approach to life. The key themes highlighted in his address are summarised below.

3.3.1 Lifestyle and Habits

The Chairman spoke about the importance of lifestyle in shaping a student's success. He noted that the transition from high school to university can be overwhelming, as it brings greater freedom accompanied by the need for personal responsibility. He stressed the value of establishing a routine that balances time for study, attending classes, extra-curricular engagement, and rest. Developing healthy habits — such as regular exercise, balanced nutrition, and adequate sleep — was described as essential to enhancing focus and productivity.

He further underscored that time management is a skill to be refined over the years. Students were encouraged to prioritise their tasks, set realistic goals, and avoid procrastination, as this would help them excel academically while maintaining a healthy work-life balance.

3.3.2 Counselling and Parental Guidance

Turning to the parents, the Chairman described their role in the journey as indispensable, noting that their support and understanding can significantly influence their child's success. He encouraged open communication and active involvement in their child's academic life, and emphasised that counselling should be a collaborative effort between parents and their children. Parents were urged to understand their children's needs, listen to their concerns, and offer guidance without imposing undue pressure.

3.3.3 Mentoring System through Faculty

Highlighting the institution's mentoring system, the Chairman described mentorship as a cornerstone of student development. Addressing the faculty, he observed that educators do not merely impart knowledge but shape the future engineers of the world. Their guidance, he noted, helps students navigate both academic and personal challenges. Faculty members were encouraged to be approachable, to offer constructive feedback, and to inspire students to achieve their best.

3.3.4 Learning Technical Courses — C, C++, Python and Cloud Computing

The Chairman encouraged students to develop fundamental technical skills early in their B.Tech journey, with a particular focus on programming. He highlighted Python as a versatile and widely used language in the industry, noting that learning it would strengthen problem-solving skills and open doors to diverse fields ranging from data science to web development.

Assuring students of the institution's support, he stated that resources would be provided to help them get started with Python. Students were advised to take advantage of workshops, online courses, and peer-learning opportunities, and to embrace coding with curiosity and enthusiasm as a tool that would serve them well throughout their careers.

3.4 Address by the Principal

The Principal welcomed the students to a new chapter in their academic journey and emphasised that discipline is the cornerstone of success. Students were urged to uphold the rules of the institution, to

be punctual, and to maintain respectful behaviour at all times. Regarding cell phone usage, it was made clear that phones are strictly prohibited during classes to ensure an undistracted learning environment, and that they should be used responsibly and only in designated areas during breaks.

He further noted that adhering to the dress code reflects professionalism and the values of the institution, and requested students to dress appropriately at all times. While academics remain the priority, students were encouraged to participate actively in extra-curricular and co-curricular activities, which are essential for holistic development. The Principal concluded by inviting everyone to work together to create a disciplined, focused, and enriching campus environment, and extended his best wishes for a successful and fulfilling journey ahead.

3.5 Address by the Head, Basic Sciences and Humanities (BS&H)

The Head of the Basic Sciences and Humanities Department welcomed the students to the beginning of their engineering journey. She noted that the department provides a strong foundation in mathematics, sciences, and communication skills, all of which are essential for technical growth. Students were encouraged to approach these early subjects with curiosity, as they form the backbone of every engineering innovation.

Beyond academics, the department places emphasis on developing soft skills, ethics, and teamwork — qualities that shape students into well-rounded professionals. Students were advised to remain disciplined, proactive, and open to learning, and were reminded that challenges are opportunities to grow and that hard work paves the way for success. She assured the students of the department's continued guidance and support, and extended her best wishes for a bright and fulfilling future.
