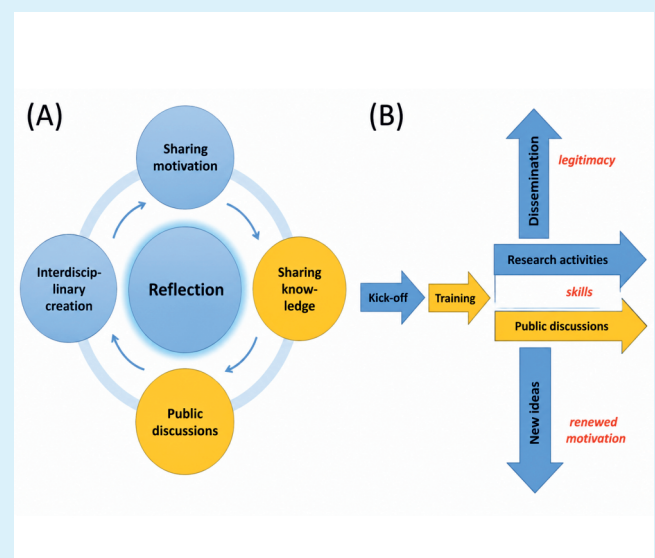
2. FACULTY ARTICLE'S ON STRENGTHENING INTERDISCIPLINARY RESEARCH COLLABORATIONS
