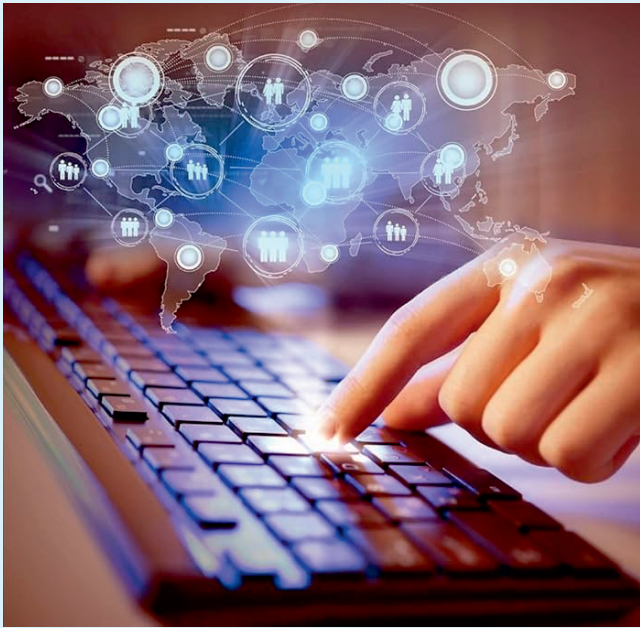
INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

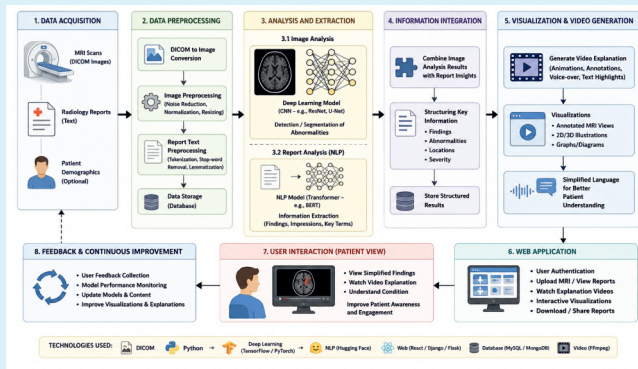

INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY CELEBRATIONS

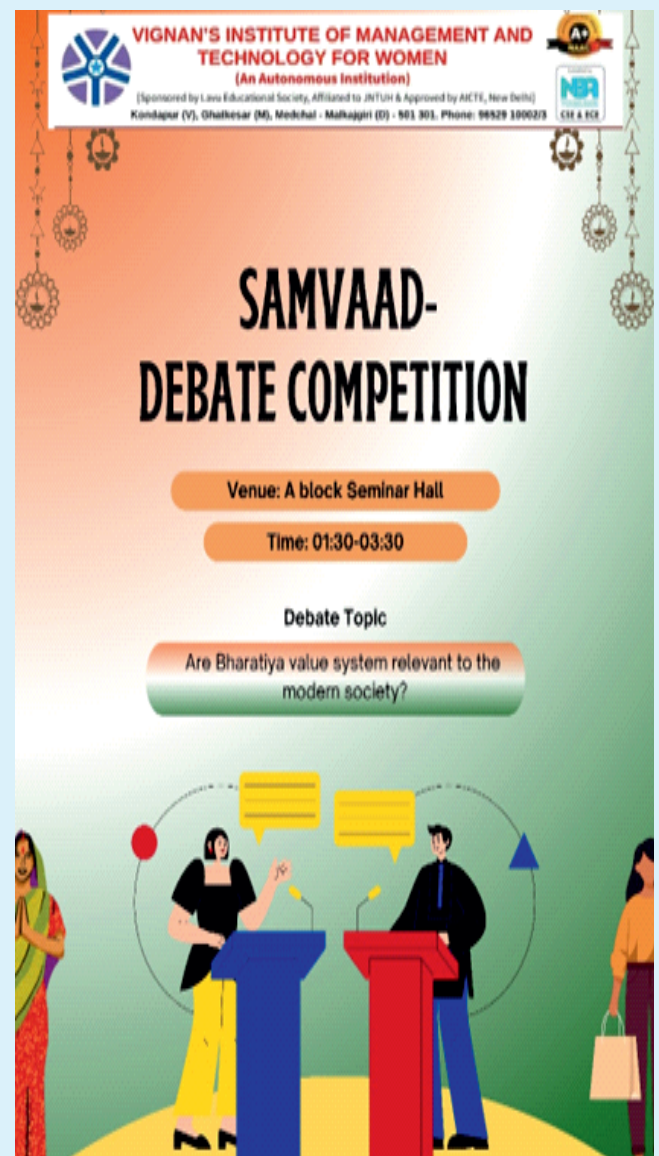

V.Awareness on “Cardiovascular Disease Risk Assessment”

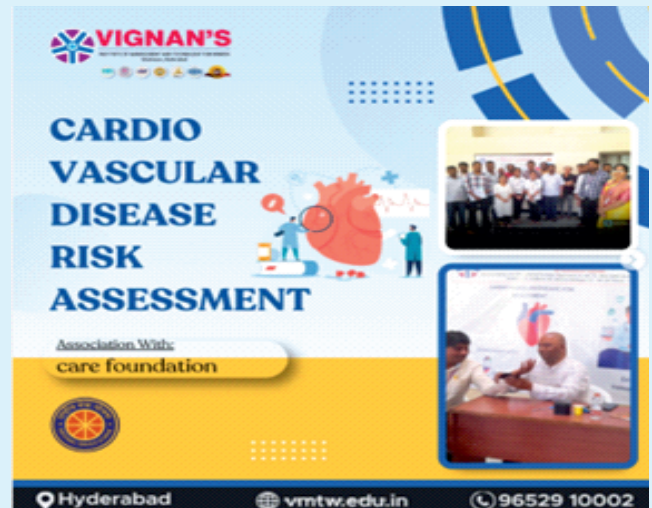
